

Gluten-Free Pumpkin Bread (Dessert)

A moist and delicious pumpkin bread with a hint of spice, perfect for fall and winter mornings.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup blanched almond flour (not almond meal)
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ¼ teaspoon celtic sea salt
- ½ cup roasted pumpkin or roasted squash
- 3 large eggs
- 2 tablespoons honey
- ¼ teaspoon stevia

Instructions:

- 1. In a food processor combine almond flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda, and salt
- 2. Add pumpkin, eggs, honey, and stevia, and pulse for 2 minutes
- 3. Scoop batter into a greased mini loaf pan
- 4. Place in oven with a cookie sheet one rack below
- 5. Bake at 350°F for 35-45 minutes
- 6. Cool for 1 hour
- 7. Serve

Happy February Foxridge!! Only a few more months until it's gardening season.

In Colorado, gardening in February isn't a common topic, but we think it should be. While the winter season invites growers to take rest in preparation for the following growing season, there is still work to be done in the garden.

Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) has developed a winter checklist that includes many projects you can work on while the snow falls.

DUG Winter Checklist

- Evaluate last year's successes and challenges
- Sketch out your garden layout, considering crop rotation and companion planting
- Register for DUG's Garden Planning Class
- Prune dormant fruit trees and hardy shrubs, damaged, or crossing branches, to encourage healthy growth in the spring
- Avoid pruning spring-flowering shrubs like lilacs or forsythia, as it will reduce blooms
- Sign up for DUG's Fruit Tree Pruning class
- Sharpen pruners, shears, and other cutting tools and clean, oil and repair any tools to extend their lifespan
- Organize your gardening supplies for easy access in the spring
- Check mulch around perennials and shrubs to maintain insulation and prevent freeze-thaw cycles
- Water trees, shrubs, and perennials during dry periods (every 4-6 weeks) to prevent winter desiccation
- Don't prune perennials until spring as their seed heads and stems provide habitat and food for beneficial insects
- Order catalogs from your favorite seed companies
- Mark your calendars to get free seeds from DUG in February


Hiring a Club Manager for 2025
