Chardonnays Rieslings Pinot Noirs Gamay/Beaujolis


Cocktail Fall Sour Whisky

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Foxridge Community Garden

Affiliation with Denver Urban Gardens Did you know that the Foxridge Community Garden is an affiliate of the Denver Urban Gardens? Denver Urban Gardens, known as DUG, was formally incorporated as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in 1985 to support Denver residents in creating sustainable, food-producing neighborhood community gardens. Before that, it started as a grassroots movement in the 1970s.

Foxridge Community Garden, which was formally established in 2019, is one of 200 DUG community gardens, including 66 school-based community gardens and 20 food forests, across the six-county Denver Metro area.

As a DUG affiliate garden, we operate under DUG's nonprofit status. So, if you donate in support of the Foxridge garden, you receive a receipt from DUG. Additionally, DUG provides liability insurance coverage for the garden and helps manage our financials. As a DUG affiliate, Foxridge Community Garden is an organic garden with herbicides and pesticides prohibited.

What does it mean to be a community garden? Community gardeners rent their beds for a fee and care for and harvest from their own plots or growing spaces. Here at the Foxridge Community Garden this year, we had gardeners who rented full beds and some who shared one of our 17 rented beds.

Additionally, we have the u-shaped kids' garden. The kids' garden uses its produce for kids programming, and donates some of the extra produce. Two of the garden's beds also were set aside as community beds, which were dedicated to growing extra produce that was donated for the food bank at the Salvation Army location on Colorado Boulevard.

Late this year we also added a raised planter for easier access for those using a walker or wheelchair.

You will also find a berry patch, pumpkin patch, and herb pots as well as an assortment of native perennials in the garden.

Ingredients:

Apple filling

- 2 ¼ pounds Granny Smith apples (about 5 large or 7 small), cored and sliced into ¼-inch thick wedges
- 1/3 cup honey or maple syrup
- ¼ cup water, bourbon,brandy, apple cider, or apple juice (I like 2 tablespoons bourbon and 2 tablespoons water.)
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons arrowroot starch or 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- ¹⁄₂ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground allspice or nutmeg

Oat, almond meal and pecan topping

- 1 cup old-fashioned oats (use certified gluten-free oats for a gluten-free crisp)
- ¹/₂ cup firmly packed almond meal or almond flour
- ¹/₂ cup chopped pecans or walnuts (optional but recommended)
- 1/3 cup lightly packed coconut sugar or brown sugar
- ¼ teaspoon fine sea salt
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- ¼ cup plain yogurt (Greek or regular)

Gluten-Free Apple Crisp Dessert

Adapted from Cookie and Kate: https://cookieandkate.com

A warm, comforting apple crisp made with a crumbly oat topping and sweet, cinnamon-spiced apples.

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Place the sliced apples in a 9" square baking dish. In a liquid measuring cup, whisk together the honey and water until combined. Add the lemon juice, starch, cinnamon, and allspice. Whisk to combine. Pour the mixture over the apples and toss to combine. Bake for 20 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, in a medium mixing bowl, stir together the oats, almond meal, pecans, coconut sugar, and salt. Mix in the melted butter and the yogurt. Stir until all of the flour is incorporated and the mixture is moistened throughout.
- 4. Once the apples have baked for 20 minutes, give them a stir and redistribute them evenly in the baking dish. Dollop small spoonfuls of the oat mixture evenly over the filling (see photos, no need to pack it down). Return the baking dish to the oven and bake for 25 to 30 more minutes, until the filling is bubbling around the edges and the top is nice and golden.
- 5. Let the crisp rest for 5 to 10 minutes before serving. Serve with vanilla ice cream. (I insist.) Leftovers keep well in the refrigerator, covered, for about 5 days.





Venus Flytrap

WHAT AM I?

Silent, efficient, it energy saves When searching for the insects it craves With a fruity smell It lures them well Into its fast-closing grave

Just a small trap, a quarter in size That quickly leads to an insect's demise With leaves like a jaw It leaves you in awe Can guess at the insect's surprise

Not a big plant, grows close to the ground In Carolinas where tall pines abound In areas boggy Where soil is soggy To watch it is to be spellbound

Brunswick County in North Carolina Is where wild the most you will find Numbers are dwindling Like fire burning kindling Growth there leads to its decline

With trigger hairs colored in green This plant makes a welcoming scene But when touched twice It's not very nice Shuts quick like a well-oiled machine

Tis a great story of how plants adapt Evolved and now has this jaw-like trap In poor soil survives By insects' demise As the leaves of the trap do snap – shut

- When an insect or spider touches its leaves and trigger hairs, the "jaws" shut very quickly sometimes within less than a second.
- It has adapted to survive in poor soil (low nitrogen levels) by trapping and eating insects and spiders that provide the nitrogen it needs.
- The leaves can distinguish between non-prey (like rain drops) and live prey.
